Session Update

The 60-day 2014 legislative session got underway Monday, January 13. One of the first orders of business was to adopt a cutoff calendar that serves as deadlines to move bills from policy committees, fiscal committees, chamber of origin (House or Senate), and so on.

This year's cutoff calendar:

January 13, 2014 First Day of Session

February 7, 2014 Last day to read in committee reports in house of origin, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.

February 11, 2014Last day to read in committee reports from House fiscal committees and SenateWays & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.

February 18, 2014 Last day to consider bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).

February 28, 2014 Last day to read in committee reports from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.

March 3, 2014 Last day to read in opposite house committee reports from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.

March 7, 2014* Last day to consider opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (Except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).

March 13, 2014 Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.

* After the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments,

differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.

As always, if the legislature cannot complete its business in the 60-day session, it may be called back for a special session of up to 30 days. Currently, legislators are hopeful that all work can be finished in the 60-day period and that no special session(s) will be necessary.

- <u>HB 2278</u> removing the requirement that a fire district be "rural," as defined as 10 or fewer persons per square mile, for the purposes of entering into an interlocal agreement with an adjacent city with an ambulance service

- <u>SB 6250</u> Requiring submission of digital copies of public employees' collective bargaining agreements.
- <u>SB 6300</u> Protecting public sector workers' rights through public disclosure of public sector unions' finances.
- <u>SB 6302</u> Addressing health insurance coverage of emergency services and conforming with certain provisions of federal law.
- <u>SB 6306</u> Exempting certain fire districts from use tax on vehicle purchases.
