### **About the Program**

The Q.U.E.S.T. series of programs were developed to meet the growing demand for skilled operators to replace those retiring from the workforce. These programs are designed to provide the RIGHT STUFF needed to be a successful Water & Wastewater Operator and Manager. Applications to the programs are open year round. Once accepted into your chosen program, you will be notified when your training flight will begin.

This is our one year 144 hour Operator training program. This program is designed to work with your utility's On the Job Training (OJT) to provide the foundational coursework needed to attain a full level 1 certification in Water Treatment, Water Distribution Management or Wastewater Treatment.

This program is also available to those not working in the career field and would lead to an Operator in Training Certification. Successful completion of this program is recognized by our Apprenticeship Committee as a path to direct entry (with a qualified employer) as a second year apprentice.

### Q.U.E.S.T. EXPLORE

WELCOME to WATER & WASTEWATER BOOT CAMP! Classes provide an introduction to Water and Wastewater Treatment & Water Distribution Management. Over a 6 week period we will EXPLORE these essential and in demand career fields. While exploring, you will also receive 37 hours of credit toward eligibility for the Washington State certification exam in the discipline you choose whether it's as a Water Treatment Plant Operator, Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator, or certification as a Water Distribution Manager. Class includes a tour of an operational Water & Wastewater Utility.

Cost: \$480

### Q.U.E.S.T 2.0

The NEXT step. QUEST 2.0 provides courses (41 hours) to help certified operators receive the training to apply for a secondary certification.

Class topics include Utility Management, Asset Inventory and Management, and Utility Sustainability. Course work comes with completion certification and CEU credits.

Cost: \$1100
