



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

- 10:15:00 802 reported suspect in custody on 2nd floor and 3 GSW pts, 1-black and 2-red
- 10:16:16 Life Flight Requested (25 Min ETA, coming from Sandpoint, ID)
- 10:17:09 E82 On Scene, Assigned patient care on 2nd floor
- 10:17:16 1 PT GSW in the back, 1 PT 2 GSW to arm, & 1 PT black
- 10:18:38 LAW announced possible 2nd shooter
- 10:20:22 4th PT found in Math classroom, GSW to lower abs. area-hip

FREEMAN AFTER ACTION REVIEW

What went right:

- Gun jammed, still had two classrooms with about 30+ students that were trapped and didn't exit
- Early Notification
- Suspect in custody early
- Excellent work by Freeman Staff
 - All three campus's on lockdown
- Establishment of Incident Command (IC) and eventual Unified Command
- Rapid assessment, treatment and transport,

FREEMAN AFTER ACTION REVIEW

- Patients extremely calm for the situation
- Good people and working with Freeman School District
- EMS / Fire CISM, Peer Support @ 11:20 being mobilized. (sent first responders home)
- Ability to handle Incidents within the incident, allergic reaction, chest pain and mother of the deceased
- Help from Area Coordinator – Operational Coordination and Planning
- Reunification with families. Tremendous patience by parents and loved ones
- Full Scale MCI/RTF Drill (Region)

FREEMAN AFTER ACTION REVIEW

What to improve:

- Communications, your system can only handle so much at one time
- Communication through PIO to the media, better use of social media
- Communication with the Hospital
- Multi LE agencies response: FBI, DEA, ATF, Park Police, BLM ranger, SO, PD, Boarder Patrol, and, who was who, hard to tell
- Helicopter landing zone not secured
- Unified Command: School, Fire, LAW, AMR, DEM

FREEMAN AFTER ACTION REVIEW

- Notification of family of injured and deceased, getting the names, local school, local parents and kids....
- Needed a base/staging manager to help direct traffic and park vehicles
- Better defined MCI and RTF dispatch types (this has already been fixed)
- Crime Scene preservation
- Personnel and Resource Accountability – Using the balance of responders from RTF response apparatus
- Logistical issues related to long duration incidents, meals, shelter, bathrooms, etc.

FREEMAN AFTER ACTION REVIEW

- Secondary sites for the incident, locker, vehicle, home, work, etc.
- Ingress and Egress for Ambulances
- All agencies table top exercise
- More MCI training
- More Training with Law Enforcement and Rescue Task Force response

REMINDER AT ALL INCIDENTS

- ESTABLISH COMMAND, ARRIVAL AND CONTROL
- ESTABLISH UNIFIED COMMAND AS NEEDED
- WORK WITH YOUR AREA COORDINATOR OR RESOURCE OFFICER
- USE ICS
- ASK FOR RECOURCES EARLY
- ASSIGN INCIDENT COMMAND AID
- ACCOUNTABILITLY

LESSONS LEARNED KEY POINTS

- PIO
- ASSIGN RESCUE GROUP SUPERVISOR TO WORK WITH RESCUE TASK FORCE
- ADDITIONAL CALLS
- COMMUNICATIONS
- PARENT/TEACHER REUNIFICATION
- NOTIFICATIONS OF VICTIMS FAMILIES
- TRAIN WITH YOUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

POST INCIDENT RECOVERY AND CARE

- CRITICAL INCIDENT STRESS MANAGEMENT (CISM)
- PEER SUPPORT
- ACTIVATE EARLY
- YOUR PEOPLE, YOUR COMMUNITIY
- WILL BE ONGOING
