What is **GEMT**

- Federally funded program that helps to cover the lost costs of a Medicaid patient heart attack example. A cost recovery process
- It is an entitled program, making it difficult for the Feds to eliminate the program
- No negative impact to the citizens or the state brings in revenue for the state
- Our hospitals have been using this program since 1996
 - Airlift NW started in 2010



Who is Eligible to Participate

Public GEMT service providers that meet all of the following criteria:

- Provide fee-for-service (billing) ambulance transports to Washington Medicaid beneficiaries
- Enrolled as a Washington Medicaid provider with a National Provider Number from CMS for the period being claimed, and
- Owned or operated by the State, a city, a county, a city and county, fire protection district, other local governmental agency, or a federally recognized Indian Tribe



Certified Public Expenditure (CPE)

- The Service Provider incurs costs for providing a Medicaid approved service
- Medicaid covers cost heart attack example
- Payments are reconciled to actual reported costs
- State pays directly to department at 50% of uncompensated cost



Costs

Federal Matching Funds Program

- Example your department is due 100k. Must write a check to state for 100k plus state fees
- Required by Feds, this process doesn't impact the state financially
- State gets your money through CMS. You will get your matching money (100k) back plus the 100k that you are due for services. Also get the state fees back. It should be about a 60-90 day time period



How Did Washington Get Involved in GEMT?

- November 2014, State Chief's had a meeting with consultants from California
- Program was implemented in California
- Central Pierce took the lead on the project Working in collaboration with the State Chief's, State Council, lobbyists and the consultants
- Keith Wright took the lead on implementing the GEMT program



Phase One

- Bills went through session HB 2007, SB 5840
- Both made it through first process HB passed 88-10, SB passed 40-7
- Round two in the Bill process Senate took HB 2007 to the floor and passed



The Governor Signed the Bill on April 29th!



- The Bills were written very well better than California
- HB 2007, SB 5840 covered all the necessary components



Phase Two Federal Authority

- Cost-based rates for GEMT requires federal approval of the new reimbursement methodology.
- Washington Health Care Authority has been tasked with Washington EMS agencies to submit a Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) to allow government agencies to receive an increased cost-based rates for ambulance transports.
- The Medicaid SPA was approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).



Phase two

- Work with AP Triton and the state to implement the program
 - Meetings with State Health Care Authority (HCA) to write the State Plan Amendment (SPA) and then negotiate it with Center for Medicare/Medicaid Services (CMS)
 - SPA defines what data is needed, when it is collected and all the rules for GEMT
- Health Care Authority is the host agency



- SPA was submitted to CMS in February of 2015
- HCA did receive questions from CMS and did reply with answers

Phase three

Educate departments across the state on the program

- Had all day seminars across the state
- Get them to participate



Impact on the Fire Service in Washington

- Medicaid participation has gone up in Washington by 43% since the ACA came into place in 2010. Will continue to go up, causing more cost issues
- Hospitals can and are signing up more people for Medicaid. This growth will continue to be an issue for the Fire Service



Impact on the Fire Service in Washington

- CARES (Community Assistance Resource Education Services) or Community Paramedicine
- A savings to CMS today we transport a Medicaid patient, the hospital gets federal money (lots)
- Doing CARES and not transporting will keep these federal costs down, keeping more money in the entitlement program and support GEMT



Impact on the Fire Service in Washington

• CPFR - 2018

- 23,556 EMS incidents
- 10,262 transports
- Approximately 20% are Medicaid
- Across the State was projected at \$100 million for departments
- State Revenue can be at or above \$20 million annually
- Private ambulance benefits from GEMT



Participating Departments in Washington

- Currently there are about 125 departments doing the GEMT program in our State
- 2017 and 2018 the GEMT program brought in \$159 million in our State
