Off The Job Injuries Take A Toll

FOCUS: Off duty recreational activities cause serious injuries to firefighters.

CHALLENGE

Every day firefighters are seriously injured in off duty accidents. Too many of these accidents are the result of recreational activities. Each year these recreational pursuits are the source of injuries to thousands of firefighters. Sadly hundreds are also killed as the result of the pursuit of excitement. Our firefighter duties are very stressful and downtime is very important. When we are off duty, we can't wait to enjoy our favorite activities! For many of us it involves outdoor sporting events such as climbing, biking, snowmobiling, riding motorcycles, water activities, riding ATV's, and hunting. We must balance our recreational interests against the potential danger our activities expose us to. We should use the same safety strategies off work as on. Every activity has risk and we should conduct an analysis prior to beginning each task. Issues such as weather, visibility, road or surface conditions, number and experience of participants, familiarity with the equipment or terrain should always be considered. Adjustments should be made to compensate for areas or situations that could put you at risk. Whatever the activity, safety should always come first. The appropriate personal protective equipment for the sport should always be worn at play just as when working. The goal is to return safely from our recreational outings rested and re-energized.
