2. Outline your project priorities ■ As a result of our **needs/risk** assessment process, we need grant help to fund: 3. 4. Locate and review the grant announcement(s)

- Get last year's grant announcement and review it; also, look at the funding award list.
- Do they typically fund fire departments?
- How much money do they give for a specific project, i.e. PPEs?

...Review the grant announcement

■ Look for a list of "ineligible" grant expenditures... most funders provide one.

...Review the grant announcement

- _____ Yes, I found a grant similar to what we need.
- No, they do not fund projects like this (move on to a different funder, do not waste your time if your project is not a good fit, because funders typically get hundreds or thousands of applications).

5. See if the grant funders timeline works for you

■ Often it can take up to a year from time of application until you have permission to spend the grant funds.

6. Identify a Team to help prepare Grant Application

- Involve others in your organization in the grant preparation process.
 - helps to gain buy-in
 - helps to build an understanding of how challenging it is to write grants.

7. Think & Brainstorm, Before You Start Writing

■ Find someone to "brainstorm" ideas with – several minds working on a proposal will help fine tune it for the highest fundability.

...Consider these 3 questions

- Our biggest operational threats related to the item we are requesting are?
- Our situation is unique (different from other FD) because?
- What measurable difference will this grant make to your FD?

8. Start early in writing your grant narrative

- Plan to have your grant narrative 75% completed before the grant deadline is announced.
- Call volume goes up as the deadline gets close!

Start early...

- Action: Go online and print out the application if it is available.
- If it is not out yet, print a copy of last year's application.
- Free WORD grant template of the narrative questions that you will need to answer for AFG. (Email me for a copy Michelle@ResourceSolutionsNow.com)

9. Determine Exactly How Much Money You Need

- Solicit 3 price quotes. Call suppliers or go online and compare three companies.
- Be sure and print out and retain all pricing and contact information.
- Include sales tax and delivery costs.

10. Keep your eye on the money/reporting requirements
