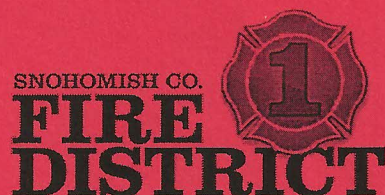

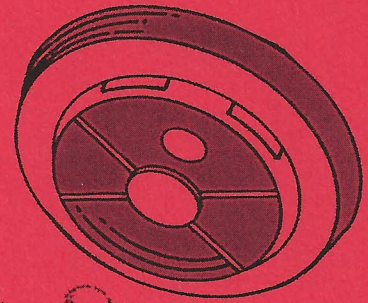

**Smoke alarms that are more than 10 years old should be replaced.**

Aging smoke alarms are unreliable and often are the source of nuisance alarms.

**How many smoke alarms?** Fire safety experts recommend you install one smoke alarm in every sleeping area of your home and at least one smoke alarm on each level of your home.

**“Borrowing” a battery can be deadly.** Taking a battery out of a smoke alarm for another use takes away its lifesaving benefits and puts you and your family at risk.

**Fire drills aren’t just for schools – practice escape at home too.**

Develop an escape plan with 2 ways out of every room, then practice so everyone knows what to do when the smoke alarm sounds.
