


### Minnesota # Youth Arrests






## Minnesota % Youth Arrests










Orange represents cases that were found using a keyword narrative search.

Blue represents cases that were located by "playing with ignition source" or "age as a factor"




### Minnesota Gender






# Minnesota Ages






# Minnesota Time of Day






### Minnesota Month of Year



### Youth Firesetting Intervention Teams (YFIT)

This program is supported by the Minnesota State Fire Chiefs Association and is similar to their Fire Assistance and Support Team (FAST) initiative.

### On-site questionnaire

You can keep this on the trucks or in chief vehicles in case you come upon a youth-set fire. This form outlines critical criteria that will help decide which actions to take with a child.

If a family comes to the fire station with a child who is starting fire, please have the intake form handy for your office staff to use.

### Youth Fire Intervention Training

Curiosity is normal; setting fires is not. The power of fire is a mystery to most people. With their first birthday candle we introduce children to fire, and promote the misconception that small fires are easily controlled. Fire is used inappropriately in advertising, in movies, on television and on You Tube.

Children have escalating access to these media which contribute significantly to youth firesetting. Arson is the fourth leading cause of fire in Minnesota. 386 youth-set fires were reported by fire departments in 2015 (Fire in Minnesota 2015).

Learn how to manage a program that will help to stop this dangerous behavior.
